



Principal's Update 16 June 2020

Dear Parent/Caregiver

We have received more news today about Step 3 of the COVID-19 roadmap and the easing of restrictions. However one of the most important requirements that remains in place is that any student or staff member with a temperature or flu-like symptoms (e.g. runny nose, sore throat, cough, headache or loss of taste/smell) must stay home and seek a COVID-19 test. If students develop symptoms during the school day, please be aware that you will be called and asked to pick up your child. Students and staff must not return to school until all symptoms have ceased. As we head into the flu season this will be new for all of us and hard to give up our pre-COVID motto of "soldiering on". I thank you in advance for your understanding.

Update:

- Physical distancing requirements remain in place for all adults:

From Monday 29 June, the following activities can resume at the discretion of the Principal and the meeting of health guidelines:

- parents, volunteers, departmental support and other service providers may again enter school and preschool grounds. Please enter via Reception.
- school assemblies
- class photos
- all intrastate camps and excursions
- all school sport competitions, sports days and carnivals, including inter-school competitions (use of change rooms and shower facilities is not permitted)
- inter-school choirs, bands and other performing art activities
- school formal
- larger face-to-face professional learning activities.

COVID-19 Requirements that remain in place:

- Students and staff should stay at home if unwell.
- Physical contact (even between students) must be limited. Non-physical greetings should be encouraged.
- The general public should not access school playgrounds or play equipment.
- Parents must continue to physical distance, including at school pick up and drop off.
- Interstate and overseas travel remains on hold.

You will receive more specific information during Term 3 as teachers take the opportunity to plan and run more activities.
