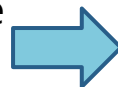

Home Group Program

Child Protection Curriculum



- All people employed by the Department for Education must have training in mandatory notification, called ***Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect – Education and Care.***
- Schools, preschools and childcare centres have a responsibility to protect children, to keep them safe and ensure that effective abuse prevention programs are implemented
- The ***Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum*** is mandated in all department schools and preschools

Home Group Program

Child Protection Curriculum







- Child safety and respectful relationships curriculum
- Developed by child protection experts including Emeritus Professor Freda Briggs
- Evidence based and highly regarded nationally and internationally
- Regularly updated to align with contemporary research and curriculum
- Implemented in department schools and preschools since 2006
- Mandated in all department sites in 2008
- Delivered by KS:CPC trained teachers
- Proactive rather than reactive



Home Group Program

Information Technology

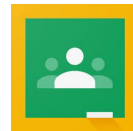
Students are required to bring an Apple iPad for years 7, 8 & 9.

WiFi Only Models Preferred, SIM cards from 4G models will need to be removed for school.



Minimum Requirements:

- Updatable to the latest iOS (currently 16 in 2022 – this may change by 2023)
- 9.7 Inch Screen (or more)*
- 128 GB (or more – 256GB Recommended)
- Sturdy Case (eg STM Dux)
- Needs to be updatable for 3 years
