
Transition **Days**

Middle School Structure




A day in the life of a year 7 student...

Wellbeing team provide support via case management for ongoing concerns or incident-related support as needed.



Students are required to bring an Apple iPad for years 7, 8 & 9.

WiFi Only Models Preferred, SIM cards from 4G models will need to be removed for school.

Minimum Requirements:

- Updatable to the latest iOS (currently 18)
- 9.7 Inch Screen (or more)*
- 128 GB (or more 256GB Recommended)
- Sturdy Case (eg STM Dux)
- Needs to be updatable for 3 years




- Student reception absences, late arrival and early departure, illness etc.

Health Care Plans

Unley High School

- Asthma Puffers: Self administered. Please fill in a 'Self Administration of Medication' form and provide your child's asthma plan to Student Services.
- Anaphylaxis: Please provide the students EpiPen and the Anaphylaxis Care Plan prior to the first day of term.
 - a. If the plan says that they may need antihistamines or other medication, we need that medication too and a medication agreement for this (not the EpiPen).
- All medication needs to have a pharmaceutical label (even over the counter) as we need to be able to link the medication to the student. (Please see label)
